In other words, it can create "transparent" elements. That means that you can make an image have a filter applied, but the filter doesn't influence the transparency of the image. That would be like putting heavy-duty tinted window film on a window, while the window itself remains fully transparent. It's completely optional, though. MASK With Photoshop Elements 2019, you can create a mask. To do so, drag one of the image's layers to the canvas. Then, begin to draw a new selection. You don't have to create an accurate selection. Once you're finished, begin to paint on the canvas by clicking a space just inside the selection. The image will mask off from the selection, leaving just the areas of the image that you want. OPACITY There are two types of opacity. One is for the whole image, and the other is for the individual layers. If you want to make any adjustments to the mask, click on the mask and then click the Opacity drop-down menu. Then, you can modify the amount of masking for the whole image or for individual layers. MASK PROPERTIES Each layer can have its own Opacity settings. If you want all the layers to have the same opacity, make sure that the Opacity drop-down menu is set to All. You'll see separate entries for each layer. To set a value for just a specific layer, simply find it in the Layers panel, click the button, and set the Opacity. ISOLATION Like
